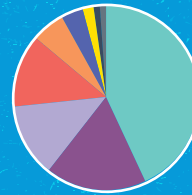

Penn State Abington provides an affordable, accessible, and high-impact education to nearly 3,000 students primarily from Philadelphia, Bucks, and Montgomery counties. Abington offers 26 bachelor's degree programs or the first two years of study for all other Penn State majors. Six pathways to master's degree programs are available to students in specific majors while they earn their undergraduate degrees at Abington, saving time and money while boosting their career prospects.

THE ABINGTON EXPERIENCE

The Abington Experience is a major new initiative that will formalize personal and professional development opportunities and reinforce a culture of student success through leadership, hands-on learning, and workforce preparation including:

- Internships and experiential learning, with the city of Philadelphia as its hub.
- Embedded (short-term) travel within the United States and abroad. Generous donors make student travel accessible to almost everyone.
- Faculty-mentored research.

CAMPUS: NEW AND RENOVATED SPACES

NEW ACADEMIC BUILDING

The \$68 million, 85,000-square-foot building will open in the fall of 2026 and feature cross-disciplinary innovative spaces; modern classrooms, studios, and labs; and collaborative work areas and offices where our students and faculty will truly thrive together.

BIOLOGY LABS

\$5 million in renovations and an addition are nearly complete.

ATHLETIC BUILDING

The proposed \$25 million renovation of the Athletic Building is expected to begin in late 2026 to support our NCAA Division III athletics.

technologies and investment opportunities, and get acquainted with the innovation community.

CONTINUING EDUCATION AND INNOVATION

Our portfolio of credit and noncredit programs provides access for working professionals

STUDENT SUCCESS

In addition to daily interactions with engaged faculty and staff, students can access programming and services including:

- **Chaiken Center for Student Success** any student may sign up for free tutoring and success coaching to keep them on the path to earning their degree.
- **Student Success Coordinator** develops roadmaps to motivate and support students facing challenges.
- **First generation students** comprise almost 50 percent of the Abington student population, with specific programs in place that include mentoring.

- **Counseling and Psychological Services, Student Care and Advocacy, and the Collegiate Recovery Program** are led by highly trained staff.
- **Scholarships and Financial Aid** 78 percent of Abington students receive financial aid and 17 percent receive University scholarships. The endowment for Abington scholarships has more than doubled, resulting in more than 200 additional students receiving support.
- **LionShare Food Pantry** is open to all.

LOCATION, LOCATION, LOCATION

Historic, eclectic, and booming with economic opportunity, Philadelphia is easily accessible to students via a quick walk to the train station from campus. This proximity provides students with optimal exposure to internships and

career options in thriving industries such as the life sciences, financial services, manufacturing, and technology, as well as a vibrant, ever-evolving entrepreneurial ecosystem rich with mentorship and networking opportunities.
